

THE SIX SOUL ELEMENTS

SOUL URGES

The need for interaction with particular people or exposure to certain elements of Nature or environments.

E.g. The need to spend time with singers or to be around water

SOUL SKILLS

The need to develop and master everyday skills required to live and be self-sufficient.

E.g. Having a very keen interest in learning how to write

SOUL TALENTS

Natural abilities within all areas of intelligence that can be learned and mastered.

E.g. Being fond of singing and taking lessons

SOUL PASSIONS

The need for specific activities which enable the activation of gifts and the development of talents and skills.

E.g. Being very passionate about learning the guitar

SOUL GIFTS

Natural abilities that are automatic and effortless, and take little or no conscious effort to develop.

E.g. Being able to teach yourself the guitar and play by ear

SOUL PURPOSE

The outcome of having evolved in all the above, through unconditional sharing and devoted service to others in the community.

E.g. Having developed all your natural gifts, talents and skills, you are able to serve people through your work

THE SIX EGO ELEMENTS

CONDITIONED MOTIVATIONS

The desire to engage with particular material aspects in the environment or certain social aspects of society.

E.g. The desire to hang out with friends at the pub

INDOCTRINATED DRIVES

The push to learn everyday skills required to survive in society and the wish to be successful in your roles.

E.g. Having to go to school to be educated

COMPENSATORY DESIRES

Pursuing mindless activities to break the sheer boredom and monotony of everyday life, with the desire to fulfil compensatory wants and needs.

E.g. Doing dangerous things just for the thrill

ADOPTED INTERESTS

Following family aspirations or social customs and traditional activities and the ongoing pursuit of related skills.

E.g. Being born into a musical family but never engaging in what you are truly passionate about

ADOPTED EGO IDENTIFICATIONS

Owning past and present successes and failures to gain respect and build a reputation.

E.g. Reliving glory days to gain admiration from others

PROGRAMMED GOALS

The result of combining all the above to compete with other egos, with the ambition of securing a higher status in society.

E.g. Having won the rat race, you selfishly indulge in luxuries and aspire to gain more fame and fortune
